

## Cause / Effect

Book pages 362-336, 385-394

Notice the many ways you can express cause / effect!

ADVERB CLAUSE (because + cause; you can change the order) Chart 17-2

1. I didn't go to school **because** I was sick.
2. **Because** I was sick, I didn't go to school.
3. I didn't go to school **since** I was sick.
4. **Since** I was sick, I didn't go to school.
5. I can go to school **now that** I am well.
6. **Now that** I am well, I can go to school. (= "because now")
7. I didn't go to school **due to the fact that** I was sick.
8. **Due to the fact that I was sick**, I didn't go to school.

PREPOSITION + NOUN PHRASE (because of + cause; you can change the order) Chart 19-1

9. I didn't go to school **because of** my illness.
10. **Because of** my illness, I didn't go to school.
11. I didn't go to school **due to** my illness.
12. **Due to** my illness, I didn't go to school.

CONJUNCTION (CONNECTING WORD-COMPOUND SENTENCE; you cannot change the order)

- |     | CAUSE                  | EFFECT                |            |
|-----|------------------------|-----------------------|------------|
| 13. | I felt sick, <b>so</b> | I didn't go to class. | Chart 19-3 |

CONJUNCTIVE ADVERB Chart 19-3

(TRANSITION WORD – COMPOUND SENTENCE OR 2 SIMPLE SENTENCES)

- |     | CAUSE                              | EFFECT                | (You cannot change the order) |
|-----|------------------------------------|-----------------------|-------------------------------|
| 14. | I felt sick; <b>therefore</b> ,    | I didn't go to class. |                               |
| 15. | I felt sick. <b>Therefore</b> ,    | I didn't go to class. |                               |
| 16. | I felt sick; <b>consequently</b> , | I didn't go to class. |                               |
| 17. | I felt sick. <b>Consequently</b> , | I didn't go to class. |                               |
| 18. | I felt sick; <b>as a result</b> ,  | I didn't go to class. |                               |
| 19. | I felt sick. <b>As a result</b> ,  | I didn't go to class. |                               |

Also possible, but unusual: I felt sick; I, therefore, didn't go to class.

I felt sick; I didn't go to class, therefore.

SPECIAL EXPRESSION (so / such ...that...) Chart 19-4

- |     | CAUSE                                  | EFFECT                     |                               |
|-----|--|----------------------------|-------------------------------|
| 20. | I felt <b>so sick</b> that             | I didn't go to school.     | so + adj                      |
| 21. | I moved <b>so slowly</b> that          | I couldn't go to school.   | so + adv                      |
| 22. | I had <b>so many absences</b> that     | I failed the class.        | so + many + plural count noun |
| 23. | I took <b>so few tests</b> that        | I failed the class.        | so + few + plural count noun  |
| 24. | I had <b>so much pain</b> that         | I couldn't move.           | so + much + noncount noun     |
| 25. | I had <b>so little energy</b> that     | I couldn't get up.         | so + little + noncount noun   |
| 26. | It was <b>such a long illness</b> that | I missed a lot of classes. | such + adj + noun             |

REDUCED ADVERB CLAUSE (You may study this later) Chart 18-4

27. Being sick, I didn't go to school. = Because I was sick, I didn't go to school.
